

# Letter from the Rectory

At this time of year as the evenings get colder and darker the Christmas lights on shopping streets and in houses seem to get brighter until by the last week in December almost every garden contains a shrub covered with fairy lights and almost every house has a brightly lit Christmas tree in the window. Even as I write this at the beginning of November the shops are



already playing Christmas music and beginning to be full of seasonal treats and Christmas decorations and I'm sure that by the time you are reading it the Christmas countdown will be in full swing with Santa and his elves in every shopping centre alongside carol singers raising money for charity. December always seems to be a mad dash towards Christmas, packed full of preparations and occasionally panic.

In the church year the season of Advent comes before Christmas. Advent is a time to prepare for Christmas but it much more than that and it is easy for the

season of Advent to get lost in the busyness of preparing for Christmas. Advent comes at the darkest time of the year, and it is a time when we both wait and prepare for our Christmas celebrations and wait and prepare for the time when Jesus will come as the light that chases away all darkness. Sometimes the pressure to have a happy Christmas can leave us feeling isolated and alone but Christians believe that the whole point of Christmas is that God himself came as a child in a Bethlehem stable so that human beings would never need to be alone and so I look forward to hearing from you if you want someone to talk to.

This will be my first Advent and Christmas in the Fiveways benefice and over the next few weeks I look forward to seeing many of you at some of the special events and services which will be happening in churches across the benefice. Whether you come alone or with family and friends you are very welcome to attend. Also, if you want a quiet space to sit and think away from the busyness, the churches across the benefice will be open during daylight hours, throughout the whole of the Christmas season, as they are all year round. However you celebrate Christmas, I pray that you will know the love of God surrounding you through Advent, Christmas and into the year ahead.

#### Chairman's report

I have complied the Parish Council entry to the Byword for quite a few years and it is now my pleasure to welcome a new person to that role – Councillor Mike Burdon. I'm sure Mike will bring lots of improvements to the look and feel of the news and information we provide and I thank him for taking on this extra task.

There are going to be Parish Council elections in the spring of 2025, West Northants Council will run the election process and you should be contacted for details of who is eligible to stand and nomination papers. This could be your chance to make a difference to our village! In the meantime, the work of the PC does not stop and there are all sorts of ideas and projects being explored, why not attend a council meeting to observe all that's going on? Following concerns raised by villagers the PC has had the white hatching lines just outside the Co-op repainted to highlight that this area is intended for short term parking for shop users, those with impaired mobility or taking bulky items to the post office. We ask that it is not occupied overnight or for long periods during the day.

If you are moving away then goodbye and good luck, thank you for being part of our community. If you are new to Byfield then you are very welcome, we are sure this will become a happy and fulfilling place for you to have your home.

#### **Parish Council duties**

The Parish Council divides its focus across a number of areas, and often acts as a liaison to West Northants Council (WNC) and relevant organisations, like those working on HS2. A list of councillors and their chosen area of responsibility is listed on the website. We encourage you to give feedback on areas across the village that you would like to see improved, developed, or looked at.

#### The Environment

The Parish Council is enthusiastic about receiving suggestions about planting trees and shrubs on any public land, as well as supporting the efforts of individuals and groups who work to improve the village. The process is simple, you can email the clerk with details of your suggestion or come to a meeting and talk about it.



The Parish Council is grateful to villagers who trim grass, plant shrubs or otherwise maintain public areas near their property, but of course – no one should be placing themselves at any risk to do this.

WNC regularly suggest that we register any issues with our roads and verges on fixmystreet.com. This includes registering potholes, fly tipping (albeit infrequent), and other issues. The more people that engage and register complaints, the more weight it will carry. WNC will then review the issue and post updates.

#### Footpaths

Remember whenever using public footpaths to follow the countryside code, pick up after you dog, leave gates as you find them and keep to established paths.

#### **Brightwell Recreation Ground**

The impressive and newly refurbished Brightwell Pavilion is available for occasional hire. Please contact the clerk with any initial enquiries.

#### **Closed Churchyard**

The Parish Council is responsible for the closed churchyard, that is the area around Holy Cross Church. We maintain the walls, cut the grass or strim dependent on the area and keep the paths clear. Care of individual memorials is the responsibility of the family or friends of the deceased and we can only take action if a memorial is unsafe.

#### Allotments

Councillor Lindsay Clark continues to oversee the area and we follow a policy of sub dividing the bigger plots into more manageable sized areas. To enquire or register your interest, please contact the clerk <u>clerk@byfield-pc.gov.uk</u>. Byfield Parishioners have priority for any plots.

We're excited to share that the Parish Council is considering the addition of an **outdoor weights gym** at the Brightwell!

This initiative aims to provide high-quality, gym-grade weights equipment for everyone in our community—completely free to use. With five equipment stations, you'll be able to complete a full-body resistance training workout, all in a space similar in size to the existing basketball court.



This isn't standard outdoor equipment; we're debating a high-spec option that provides better functionality and durability, designed to serve villagers of all abilities, from young adults to seniors. You don't need to be a gym enthusiast to make use of this facility—it's intended to be accessible to everyone!

Your feedback is essential since this gym would be for the entire village, we want to ensure it reflects the needs and preferences of our community. Whether you're a fitness fan, a curious neighbour, or someone

who simply wants to make Byfield an even better place to live, your opinion matters. We've already received helpful comments through our Facebook page and at recent public forums, but we'd love to gather even more feedback. Additionally, we're reviewing various installation options around the Brightwell and looking into liability aspects to make sure we have a well-rounded plan.

# **Bishop Ed is running the London Marathon 2025**

I'm running the London Marathon again. This will be my 11<sup>th</sup> marathon. My last – who knows? I shall be 72.

I am running it for the national charity **Sense** which has been marvellous in supporting our granddaughter Mia. If you are able to sponsor me that would be great. I have a justgiving page



at <u>www.justgiving.com/page/edward-.condry-trimarathon</u>. Sense works with those who are deaf or blind and who those have serious physical disabilities. Mia was born with no eyes and is permanently in a wheelchair. She has nevertheless done much. She has been to the theatre and to rugby matches. She sings in a choir. She has even been surfing in Wales, with her wheelchair strapped to the board. I am running the London with our daughter, Fran, Mia's mum.

Sense has provided Mia with monthly sensory play sessions at home with an incredible lady called Anne who has been visiting her for 15 years . She has been lucky enough to attend Sense holidays - 5 day sensory adventures around the UK with Sense workers and volunteers. These help her parents to have a break and open up Mia's horizons to new people, opportunities and independence.

The marathon will also (I hope) complete a London "tri-

marathon" of the RideLondon 100 mile bike ride in May 2024; the 22 mile Great River Race rowing on the Thames through London in September 2024 (that's five Oxbridge Boat Races) and the London Marathon itself, running on April 27th 2025. The Cycling and the Rowing marathons are now done, both with our son Jerome - "just" the 26 miles of the marathon left on April 27th 2025.

Fairly serious training is now started.

# Christmas Bin Collections

- There will be no garden waste collections from Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> December to Monday 6<sup>th</sup> January.
- Real Christmas trees will be collected on Monday 6<sup>th</sup> January. This service is available to everyone not just garden waste bin subscribers.
- If you have more recycling than will fit in your bin, then you can put it in clear or white plastic bags or cardboard boxes and place alongside your recycling bin on the appropriate day.
- Food waste caddies will continue to be collected weekly. Remember that you can recycle leftover raw and cooked food including vegetable peelings, egg shells, out-of-date food, plate scrapings, solid fats, meat and fish bones.
- Don't forget that you can line your kitchen caddy with any bag it doesn't have to be a compostable bag.
- Household waste Recycling Centres will be open at the usual times during the Christmas season except for Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Year's Day when they will be closed. Centres will also close early at 2pm on Christmas Eve.


